

Managing Directors Message

Why Biodiversity Matters

Nearly 15 per cent of the forests in South-East Asia - the home of much of our diverse animal and plant species - have been lost in the last decade and a half alone.

Environmental issues are at the forefront of many people's concerns about the future.

Halting or at least slowing down the rate of global warming is the focus of much of this attention.

A lot of progress is being made at a community, national and global level as the transition to renewable, climatefriendly energy to combat warming gathers pace.

This is very welcome. There is another important environmental issue, however, which needs our attention and action.

The level of biodiversity – the quantity and richness of our animal and plant life on our planet - is under as much threat as our climate.

Human development, particularly as our cities rapidly expand – is accelerating the loss of natural habitats.

The facts are quite alarming – the World Wildlife Federation estimates wild life globally has declined by nearly 70 per cent over the past 50 years.

Forest clearing is a particular problem in our region.

Biodiversity Decline Impacts Us All

A loss of biodiversity has major impacts beyond the natural environment. It reduces the environment's ability to renew itself. This means more water and air pollution that impacts directly on our health and living standards.

Forests and natural greenery also play an important role in absorbing carbon produced by fossil fuels. So deforestation and loss of biodiversity plays a part in higher temperatures.

All this can sound dispiriting. But at the same time, we all have in our hands the possibility of helping to turning this situation around.

I've mentioned a number of times in this column the important role of property development in society.

Property developers have the privilege - and therefore the responsibility - of designing and building the asset which has the biggest impact on people's lives.

The design and quality of a home determines how we spend our free time, what we prioritise as well as what we value.

Biodiversity a Property Priority

One of Eupe's key priorities in designing homes is to create a rich natural environment of plant life and greenery within our high-rise buildings.

We do this in two ways. The first is maximising the quantity of green space in our developments. With our projects, we aim to significantly exceed the amount of green space that what is required by planning laws.

The second objective is to maximise the quality of nature within these green spaces. This mean design and selection of plants and trees - particularly native spices - that maximise the richness and diversity of nature.

There is abundant research that tells us that connecting people with nature improves and sustains our individual mental and physical well-being.

So Eupe's commitment to increase biodiversity not only builds environmental sustainability, but increases what we call social sustainability – the well-being of our ourselves and the communities we build.

Building Green Communities

By embedding nature within the homes we develop, we also aim to give our residents a deeper appreciation of nature, and a commitment to renewing it.

We have been recently organising events inviting our buyers and their friends and families to 'rehabilitate' nature in their own homes.

The Green Community events program provide the opportunity to learn home gardening and planting skills so they grow their very own patch of biodiversity.

These might seem a very small contribution to a global problem.

But imagine if the planning of every new residential development aimed to maximise the quantity and quality of its green space.

And imagine if this inspired every resident to nurture biodiversity on their balconies and in their indoor gardens.

Building green communities - particularly in our cities - is one thing we all can contribute to a more sustainable future for ourselves and the planet.

Parcs recognised by world-renowned FIABCI award

Eupe's second KL high-rise project -Parc3 @ KL South - has been announced as the winner of the Residential High Rise category at the FIABCI Malaysia Property Awards 2023 - the highest standard in real estate excellence.

The nature-inspired urban landmark completed in December 2021 - embeds Eupe's core sustainability practices such as passive cooling, green living with a communal herb garden and three parks that flow into the 64-acre Taman Pudu Ulu park it faces.

With a GreenRE Gold score of 89.64%, total green spaces 3 times more than required by planning regulations, the Highest Hanging Sculpture in a Residential Building certified by the Malaysia Book of Records and a Qlassic Score of 82%, the high accolade is the latest in a series of sought-after property awards won by Parc3.

Parc3 was announced the winner of the award at the annual Malaysia Property Awards dinner in Kuala Lumpur on March 9.

The rigorous a judging standards include multiple stages of verification, physical site visits and reviews by experts within the property industry. FIABCI itself has been a world recognised organisation for over 71 years, representing every discipline in the real estate industry. It represents the world's real estate professions through its special consultative status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations. Eupe's Group Managing Director, Dato' Beh Huck Lee said, "A FIABCI award is very sought-after in the property industry and we're grateful Parc3 has been recognised in such a way. Importantly, the award shows we have been successful in creating a memorable home of lasting value for Parc3 buyers."

Parc3 will now go on to compete internationally against residential highrise projects from 60 other countries at the FIABCI World Prix d'Excellence Awards at the Gardens by the Bay, Singapore on 30 May this year.

Donating Life

On 28 November 2023, the Eupe Sungai Petani office held a blood donation day "Give Blood To Give Life". It was open to employees in Wisma Ria from various organisations such as CIMB Bank, the Valuation and Property Services Department (JPPH), the Ministry of Domestic Trade And Cost of Living (KPDNKK), CEO Pods, army personnel from the nearby KEM Lapangan Terbang base camp and its own employees.

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In line with Eupe's "Building Strong Communities" philosophy, the blood drive was organised to give back to the Sungai Petani community by providing blood supply for medical emergencies, surgeries and treatments, raise awareness on the importance of voluntary blood donation and encourage regular blood donation for health benefits. From 9 am to 2 pm, Eupe collaborated with medical officers from Hospital Sultan Abdul Halim to conduct the campaign at Eupe's own building, Wisma Ria. A mix of first time and seasoned donors attended the blood drive. Some of the first-time donors shared that they were nervous before the donation but happy and satisfied after.



"I've always wanted to donate blood, but I've never gotten the chance due to my busy schedule. With Eupe organizing this blood drive, I'm delighted to finally have the opportunity to contribute", said Fatin, a first-time donor and Eupe employee from the Accounts department.

Sylvene from Eupe's Sales and Marketing department, said: "I'm excited to know that this little contribution of 250ml of blood can actually save someone's life."

A total of 80 participants donated blood resulting in 47 blood bags. The blood bags were entrusted to Hospital Sultan Abdul Halim to be used as part of Sungai Petani's blood bank.





BRING YOUR WASTE TO WORK

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In line with Eupe's commitment to sustainability and our overarching strategy, Sustainability Plus, the company has launched a "Bring Your Waste To Work" campaign. It's a major component of Eupe's Reusing Nature to Renew Nature initiative which promotes a circular economy, by replacing chemical and man-made products in Eupe's operations with natural alternatives.

The primary objective of the "Bring Your Waste To Work" campaign is to collect and recycle food and kitchen waste, and transform it into compost fertiliser for landscape use at Eupe's projects, offsetting the use of chemical fertiliser.

This program involves Eupe's staff, all tenants at Wisma Ria, - the building in SP where Eupe has its headquarters - who voluntarily bring in their weekly food waste for conversion into compost.

It also involves food and other kitchen waste collected from Eupe's other operations, including its Cinta Sayang Resort and Eupe's Food Court.

The program was launched on 8 January 2024.

In its first 6 weeks alone, the "Bring Your Waste To Work" program collected and composted 2,232 kg of organic waste.

Fruit waste, coffee grounds, tree prunings, shrub trimmings, and dried leaves are gathered and combined to create nutrient-rich compost material, encouraging microbial activity essential for plant growth.

The resulting material is being used for the landscaping in Villa Natura and the Cinta Sayang Resort.

At the 8 January launch, Eupe staff as well as tenants from Wisma Ria and representatives from Cinta Sayang Resort, received technical briefings from Mr. Jerry Lim, Eupe's Landscape Manager, on composting procedures and sustainable development goals being achieved.

The composting process, facilitated by a specially constructed compost pile at Cinta Sayang Landscape Nursery, involves careful monitoring and periodic turning and mixing to quicken decomposition.

Over a span of 6-12 months, the compost material matures into fertiliser, enhancing soil structure and promoting sustainable agriculture practices.

By transforming organic waste into valuable resources, Eupe also contributes to the reduction of methane - a global warming gas - and enhances biodiversity.

Moreover, the campaign fosters sustainability awareness and community engagement, in environmentally responsible practices.

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Embracing Tradition Embracing Sustainability



Eupe hosted another of its Green Community events at the Est8 Sales Gallery on the 24th of February 2024.

Eupe's Green Community program encourages Eupe buyers and supporters by learning about planting and gardening as part of promoting environmental awareness in the home and in doing so nurture their own 'green communities'. The Green Chinese New Year Celebration event was a fusion of Eupe's dedication to fostering a greener tomorrow while celebrating the spirit of the festive season.

Invitations to attend was extended to Eupe's Klang Valley purchasers, the Seputeh community, where Est8 -Eupe's latest KL project is sited - and the general public.

The celebration featured two workshops. The first explored the art of crafting mini ecosystems at a terrarium workshop and in the process, learning about the importance of a balanced ecosystem.

The second, an edible gardening workshop led by Eats, Shoots & Roots, provided a beginner friendly approach for attendees to plant care and how to start their own home gardens.

A second performance by Pusat Kreatif Kanak-Kanak Tuanku Bainun featured a cultural drum performance - The 24 Festive Drums, symbolising unity and heritage.

Embracing the spirit of collaboration, Eupe also welcomed Food Bank Malaysia to set up a philanthropic booth to sell products and raise money to support their food relief programs.

Sprout-Acufar News!

This year, Eupe has been working with Eats, Shoots and Roots - a local social enterprise that empowers urbanites to grow food - to provide seed packets to its home purchasers to grow from the comfort of their home.

Complete with peat pellets and beginner-friendly instructions, purchasers have everything they need to grow these seeds into edible herbs like Thai Basil and Dill that can be harvested multiple times and used in various types of cooking. To encourage urban gardening, Eupe launched its latest social media contest - Sprout-acular on 7 February 2024! Open to all KL buyers from Novum, Parc3, Est8 and Helix2, the contest requires participants to grow the seeds from the seed packets given to them and explore various ways to use them.



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Composting Made Easy



Composting offers a simple and eco-friendly solution to waste reduction and soil enrichment. In this article, we'll guide you through the process of setting up your compost bin and how to reap the benefits of composting for your garden.

Composting is an excellent way to get rid of organic kitchen waste such as fruit and vegetable scraps.

> Eggshells, once washed, help improve soil structure and quality.

Turning and mixing your compost pile is an important part of the process.

The nutrient-rich result is extremely beneficial to plants.

The first step is choosing the type and location for your compost bin. Consider factors such as size, ventilation, and durability. Place your bin in a well-drained area with good airflow and partial sunlight. Avoid concrete or asphalt surfaces to create an optimal environment.

Once your compost bin is set up, it's time to begin adding materials. Vegetable scraps and fruit skins are valuable contributions because they are rich in essential nutrients like potassium and nitrogen, which promote healthy plant growth.

Eggshells contribute calcium to the soil and improve its structure, while coffee grounds and filters provide nitrogen and carbon to the composting process.

Brown materials like yard trimmings,

shredded paper, and cardboard add structure and balance to your compost heap. Maintaining a balance between green (nitrogen-rich) and brown (carbonrich) materials is crucial for successful composting. Green materials include kitchen scraps and grass clippings, while brown materials encompass dried leaves and shredded paper.

However, not all organic materials are suitable for composting. Avoid composting meat, dairy, oils, and pet waste, along with diseased plants and synthetic materials, as they can disrupt the composting process and attract pests.

To ensure successful composting, it's essential to keep the pile moist.

Moisture encourages microbial activity and organic matter breakdown, but be

cautious of waterlogging, which can suffocate beneficial microbes.

Regularly air the pile by turning or mixing it.

Composting is a gradual process that requires patience and regular monitoring. It may take several months for organic materials to transform into nutrient-rich compost.

Monitor the pile's progress and adjust as needed, such as adding water or turning the pile.

Once your compost achieves a dark, crumbly texture and emits an earthy smell, it's ready for use. Add it into your garden soil, providing plants with essential nutrients and improving soil water retention.
